Railway Road Revival

Leigh Neighbours, the million pound charity based in Leigh West, recently drafted in support from across the community as part of their mission to improve Railway Road, kicking things off with a spring clean around the car park. But as they're keen to point out, there's much more to this campaign than just tackling litter!

As part of their spring clean on Friday 7th April, the charity carried out some consultation with local residents to find out what they thought of Railway Road and how it could be improved. And the findings confirmed the frustration many feel.

Susan Gredecki, chair of Leigh Neighbours, says: "The response was unanimous: something needs to be done about Railway Road. One of the main issues highlighted to us was the prevalence of anti-social behaviour and drug-related criminality, which some people told us they find very intimidating, so much so they tend to avoid the area. The physical environment was also a serious concern. Empty buildings, shuttered shop fronts and litter create an overwhelming air of depression and neglect which residents are keen to see addressed. They want the area to be brighter, busier and safer.



Volunteers collected 20 bags of rubbish, dug out kerblines, cut back trees and shrubs, cleared weeds and nettles and painted the fence around the car park. The results look great!

Leigh Neighbours on a mission to improve the area

It was sheer frustration that led John Gredecki to finally pick up the phone and call his MP to ask for help.

After years of religiously cleaning up the alleyway along the side of his property on Gordon Street, John had quite simply had enough.

"I've always been proud of where I live. I was born and bred here, and I've raised my family in this street. But over the years, the neighbourhood has changed and some people these days don't show the same respect for their neighbours. Keeping the alleyway clean has become more and more of a challenge. The fly-tipping. The litter. The dog waste. I'm struggling to keep on top if it. And I'm afraid it's getting the better of me."

What John's talking about is anti-social behaviour of the worst kind: the type of thoughtlessness that affects quality of life for those affected, depresses an area, and robs it of its pride.



That's when John called in his MP, Andy Burnham, to assess the problem and find a solution. But it didn't end there... Mr Burnham also invited the chief executive of Wigan Council, Donna Hall, to join him - and she in turn was accompanied by two of her most senior officers in the local authority. It was, John believed, an opportunity not to be missed!

"We were delighted to host some of the most influential people in our Borough," explains John. "We took them on a tour and showed them examples of the work we're doing in partnership with many people in the community. We talked about some of the big issues: empty properties, neglected wasteland, anti-social behaviour and grot spots.



He adds: "And we talked about the good stuff, too. Our investment programme for refurbishing community facilities. Our campaigns with schools. The activities and events we organise. The fantastic volunteers we work with. The local charities and groups we give funding to. Our ambitions and hopes. I think it's fair to say that everybody left the meeting feeling very optimistic about the future. Yes, there's a lot of work to be done, but we've got a commitment from the local authority that they're in total support of what we're doing and the good news is that they are keen to work with us."
