When Markus Symonds mastered riding his bike this summer nobody could have been prouder than his folks. But what his dad, Phil, didn't count on was suddenly finding himself back in the saddle, too — after nearly twenty years!

"It's years since I rode a bike", explains Phil. "But when Markus started riding this summer, I could see he was having so much fun, I found myself thinking it would be a good idea to invest in a bike for me, as well. So now, we're out every weekend together, come rain or shine."

And this new found love of cycling is all down to Markus! The 5 year old from Waterview Park in Leigh took part in Sacred Heart's Summer School, a week-long programme of fun activities and learning sponsored by Leigh Neighbours. In support, of the event, Wigan-based social enterprise, Gearing Up, donated 12 bikes to the school to give youngsters a chance to develop their confidence in the saddle.

And Markus didn't waste any time having a go! "I love riding my bike, and it's great going out on rides with my dad," he says. Phil adds: "There are obvious health benefits to cycling but it's more than that. When you're out on bike rides, you're also learning about geography, local history and the natural environment, too, so it's a great activity for the whole family to do together."

We met up with Markus and his folks at our recent **Be Seen, Be Safe** cycle event at Sacred Heart. Board member John Gredecki

says: "It was a great success, another example of how the Leigh Neighbours lottery money is being put to good use in the community, by helping our kids be more visible when out and about on the roads this winter."





CALLING TIME ON CRIME

Our recent Crime & Community Safety event attracted residents and local groups from across Leigh, keen to talk to police and council officers about their concerns relating to all kinds of antisocial behaviour — including neighbour nuisance and grot spots.



PCSO Gabrielle Fitzsimmons says: "A lot can be achieved through partnership working, so events such as this are useful because they bring all parties together under the one roof. It facilitates communication and helps us resolve matters quicker for local people. Residents play a significant role in helping us tackle crime and community safety issues by talking to us about their concerns. They're the people who know what's going on in their community. And all information is treated in the strictest confidence."

Susan Gredecki, chair of Leigh Neighbours, adds: "We've had some really positive feedback from residents about these surgeries so we will be holding more of them next year. If you have any issues, don't suffer in silence, come and talk to us."

That's one <a> of of an opportunity!

You told us one of your concerns for the area was the lack of opportunity for people who want to develop their skills or get back into work. Well, we took that on board and in 2014, we invested in a young school-leaver — our fabulous apprentice landscaper, Aaron Block. It's been such a resounding success that we decided to invest in a second apprentice-ship scheme with Groundwork - and we're delighted to report that our newest recruit has hit the ground running!



Ian Trengove of Cook Street in Leigh recently completed his induction at Groundwork and is looking forward to a time when he'll be able to show his son Cameron the ropes. "That's my ambition, explains the 49 year old father of 3. "I'd love to go into business with my son, so this opportunity will give me the skills, qualifications and confidence to bring me closer to achieving that goal." So far, Ian has been working on a variety of projects across the region, including Landscaping the grounds of Wigan & Leigh Hospice. "I'm working towards an NVQ in Landscape Design which involves both practical and academic training. I've always been hands-on in my previous jobs, so I'm not phased by much. I'm relishing the challenge and I'm really excited about making a difference for local people."

John Gredecki of Leigh Neighbours says: "It's not just young people we want to support through our apprenticeship scheme, it's anybody who shows a will to get on in life. We were impressed with Ian's determination and we look forward to hearing how he progresses in 2016."
